Evidence taken at Victoria Downs
this 2nd day of July
concerning the death of
William James Stewart
Before V. J. Poynter J.P.

Patrick Heher being sworn states
I am owner of Victoria Downs Station
the deceased W. J. Stewart was erecting
a fence for me by contract on Sunday
the 18th about 10 o'clock he came to the
Station for some supplies. He appeared
at eight - at about 11 o'clock at night
he told me that he did not feel well. He
asked for some laudanum I told him
I had none but I gave him some chloro.
amide. I understood him to say that he
had dysentery. He then went to the Hut
I saw him again about 1/2 past eight
next morning he was then sleeping.
At about 1 o'clock he had a fit.
I then put up a horse to send to Doctor
Lowers for a Doctor but within half
an hour he died. I was not with
him when he died.

Patrick Heher

Heher recalled

I sent a man to the Joneses to report the case
to the police immediately after his death
The distance to the Joneses is 3 1/2 miles.

Made a coffin & on Tuesday about noon
o'clock I found that the body was beginning
to decompose & buried it.

Saw and sworn at Victoria
town this 2nd day of July
1896 before me

Patrick Heher
V. J. Poynter J.P.

Michael Claffey being sworn stated
I am short man at Victoria Downs
I knew the ocean.

On Sunday the 18th he came to my
house he asked me to light a fire as he
was cold & did not feel well.
he then took a took a small dose
of Chloroform. Between 1 & 2 o'clock
at night I heard moving about
& I saw that he was in a fit. I went
to him & held him while the fit lasted
about 7 or 8 minutes. he did not
speak to me then & never spoke again
till he died. from that time he had
fits about every 10 or 15 minutes.
I remained with him all the time &
supported him during the fits which
continued all the night & next day
till about 2 o'clock p.m. when he had
a worse fit & then died quietly.
I then sent a boy to see Mr. Hether.
& he came & told me to go to Charles
Innes & sent the case to the Path
which I did.
After taking the dose of Chloroform
he took about 2 two tea spoonful of
"Pain killer".
