Order of Unveiling, by His Excellency the Governor-General of Australia, the Right Hon. Lord Forster, P.C., G.C.M.G., &c., and of Dedicating, the Cross of Sacrifice and Stone of Remembrance at Toowong Cemetery, Brisbane, Queensland.

8.30—Solemn music by the band.

8.48—Dead March in Saul.

8.57—His Excellency the GOVERNOR-GENERAL arrives.

The National Anthem is played.

*During the playing of the National Anthem all ranks stand at attention, but do not salute.*

His Excellency is received by the Acting Premier, The Hon. W. N. GILLIES, representing the State Government, by the Field Officer Commanding Troops in Queensland, Major-General BRUCHE, C.B., C.M.G., and by the Commanding Officer, H.M.S. "Dragon," Captain B. W. M. FAIRBAIRN, O.B.E., and proceeds through the Cemetery Gates to the Stone of Remembrance.

*During the procession silence is observed.*

9.0—At the foot of the Stone of Remembrance His Excellency is received by the officiating clergymen, who with him ascend the steps.



Psalm 46 is read by the Moderator of the Presbyterian Assembly of Queensland, the Right Reverend S. MARTIN:—

God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble.

Therefore will not we fear, though the earth be removed, and though the mountains be carried into the midst of the sea;

Though the waters thereof roar and be troubled, though the mountains shake with the swelling thereof.

There is a river, the streams whereof shall make glad the City of God, the holy place of the tabernacles of the Most High.

God is in the midst of her; she shall not be moved: God shall help her, and that right early.

The heathen raged, the kingdoms were moved: He uttered his voice, the earth melted.

The Lord of Hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge.

Come, behold the works of the Lord, what desolations He hath made in the earth.

He maketh wars to cease unto the end of the earth; He breaketh the bow, and cutteth the spear in sunder; He burneth the chariot in the fire.

Be still, and know that I am God: I will be exalted among the heathen, I will be exalted in the earth.

The Lord of Hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge.

**His Excellency then unveils the Stone of Remembrance and, accompanied by the officiating clergymen, proceeds to the Cross of Sacrifice, which he unveils, and then returns to his position at the Stone of Remembrance.**

The following prayers are said by His Grace the Archbishop of Brisbane, the Most Reverend Dr. SHARP; and the Moderator of the Presbyterian Assembly of Queensland, the Right Reverend S. MARTIN.

**The Archbishop—**

In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost. Amen.

**The Archbishop and People—**

Our Father, which art in Heaven, Hallowed be thy Name, Thy Kingdom come, Thy will be done, in earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, As we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; But deliver us from evil. Amen.

**The Archbishop—**

Almighty God, with whom do live the spirits of just men made perfect, after they are delivered from their earthly bodies, and with whom the souls of the faithful are in joy and felicity; we yield Thee hearty thanks for the noble example of our brethren who laid down their lives for King and Country. We humbly beseech Thee to grant them, O Lord, eternal rest; and of Thy gracious goodness, shortly to accomplish the number of Thine elect, and to hasten Thy Kingdom; and teach us who survive so to number our days, that with them we may in the end attain everlasting Life; through Jesus Christ, our Mediator and Redeemer. Amen.

**The Moderator—**

Almighty and Everlasting God, who of Thy tender love towards Mankind has sent Thy Son our Saviour Jesus Christ, to take upon Him our flesh and to suffer death upon the Cross, we beseech Thee to bless and hallow this Cross, that it may be an assurance of Thy love for those who laid down their lives for us and of their salvation and Peace, through the same Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

**The Archbishop—**

In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost, I dedicate this Cross to the Honour and Glory of Almighty God, and in memory of those who laid down their lives after the example of Him who made the one perfect Sacrifice for all mankind. Amen.

The Naval Guard fires Three Volleys.

The "Last Post" is sounded.

*During the sounding of the "Last Post" officers in uniform come to and remain at the salute, other Returned Soldiers in uniform stand at attention, those not in uniform and civilians stand with heads uncovered.*

His Excellency the GOVERNOR-GENERAL speaks.

The Honourable the ACTING PREMIER speaks.

Wreaths are placed at the Stone of Remembrance by—

His Excellency the GOVERNOR-GENERAL,

The ACTING PREMIER on behalf of the State Government of Queensland,

The Commanding Officer, H.M.S. "Dragon," on behalf of the Special Service Squadron.

The Anzac Day Commemoration Committee,

The Returned Sailors and Soldiers' Imperial League.

The Reveillé is sounded.

His Excellency departs.

Wreaths are then placed at the Stone of Remembrance by those so desiring.



The Cross of Sacrifice and Stone of Remembrance erected in Toowong Cemetery is a replica of the memorials erected in the war cemeteries on the continent of Europe and elsewhere in the Empire.

Their Majesties the King and Queen visited some of these cemeteries in 1922, and paid their homage at the memorial. Their action suggested to the Anzac Day Commemoration Committee the erection of a similar memorial in honour of those men from the First Military District who laid down their lives in the War. It should be remembered that at the time of the War the First Military District comprised the Northern Rivers of New South Wales and Queensland. Toowong Cemetery was chosen as the site of the memorial because some 350 returned soldiers have been laid to rest therein.

The Anzac Day Commemoration Committee desires to express its gratefulness to the State Government of Queensland, which most willingly acceded to the Committee's request to give all the stone required, to provide the plans, and supervise the erection. All other expenditure is being met by the Committee.

The Committee desires also to acknowledge the action of the Trustees of the Toowong Cemetery in placing the site at its disposal for the erection of the memorial.

The Committee considers it fitting that the name of no individual concerned in the erection of the memorial, nor of any soldier, should be placed upon it. It will be sufficient for all time that those in whose honour and to whose memory the memorial is erected shall be remembered as those whose "Name liveth for evermore." For a similar reason no individual is mentioned in this paragraph.
