TITLE: Staffing Requirements of the Queensland Cultural Centre Trust.

CABINET decided:-

- That approval be given to an increase of 33 (from 33 to 66) in the staff of the Queensland Cultural Centre Trust to a total of 21 permanent salaried staff and 45 wages employees.
- Phat appointments of salaried and wages staff be made progressively in accordance with need and experience and availability of funds.
- 3. That approval for the increased staffing, as outlined in the Submission, be on the understanding that no significant increase in staffing will be necessary to accommodate the future operation of the Museum and Library at the Centre.
- 4. That additional funds be provided as determined by Treasury, with the necessary Unforeseen Expenditure being sought in due course.

FOR CABINET STAFFING REQUIREMENTS OF THE QUEENSLAND CULTURAL CENTRE TRUST The Queensland Cultural Centre Trust has the responsibility 1. for overall operation and maintenance of the mechanical and electrical services, air conditioning, building structures, external security, etc. for the Queensland Cultural Centre as a whole. These responsibilities are separate and distinct from the individual tenants of the Centre, such as the Queensland Performing Arts Trust. As a consequence of the completion of the Performing Arts Complex building and with its full operation only a matter of months away, a significant expansion in the number of staff employed by the Cultural Centre Trust will be necessary, particularly in relation to technical wages staff to service this additional building. In anticipation of the opening of the Performing Arts Complex, the Trust sought, as part of the 1984/85 Budget Submission, a total increase of 33 in its staff establishment. The new overall staff establishment of 66 represented the Trust's perceived minimum staffing levels, with the wages staff requirements based on advice from officers of the Works Department. Treasury does not consider it is in a position to 4. effectively assess the staffing request. However, because of the funding implications involved, it is nevertheless concerned to ensure that staffing levels are kept to a minimum and avoid any duplication with the functions of the Performing Arts Trust. Advice from the Public Service Board when the staffing requirements of the Performing Arts Trust were examined was that there was no duplication of staff between the two Trusts. While the 1984/85 State Budget provided for an initial 10 5. additional staff for the Trust, there have been strong representations that the full budget request of 33 additional staff be met. ../2.
