RE: SURPLUS - WORKERS' COMPENSATION BOARD OF QUEENSLAND DISTRIBUTION OF BONUSES

- The Final Accounts of the Workers' Compensation "Fund" for 1984/85 have been prepared by the Board's Accountant and were considered at a special meeting of the Board on 27 September 1985.
- These indicate a net surplus in the "Fund" of \$40,522,378 made up as follows:

3. This surplus is not sufficient to allow a Merit Bonus at the levels ranging from 2½% to a maximum of 60% as has applied for a number of years. However, the surplus plus an adjustment to the Bonus account of \$4m appropriated from the previous year's surplus to the General Reserve will allow a Merit Bonus Distribution ranging from 2% to a maximum of 50% and also a distribution of surplus in the Industrial and Mining Diseases (Section 14B) Underwriting Account. It is still considered that a maximum merit bonus of 50% is a real incentive to encourage safety by individual employers.

- 4. The overall surplus as at 30 June 1985 has been affected by the following -
 - (a) Total amount for overall Claims Paid increased by 11.9%
 - (b) New Common Law Claims Intimated increased by 46.8%
 - (c) Payments for Common Law Claims increased by
 This has been affected by larger Court Awards.
 - (d) Intimated Outstanding Common Law Claims increased by 15.4%
 - (e) Provisions for unsettled Common Law Claims increased

It is estimated the overall expenditure for Merit Bonuses based on the levels ranging from 2% to 50% for 1984/85 will be \$44m.

-3-The Board has recommended to me: 6. (a) The surplus as at 30 June 1985 be be appropriated as follows: \$ 39,562,773 Bonus Distribution Surplus - Industrial and 959,605 Mining Distribution \$ 40,522,378 (b) The balance of \$1,031,057 in the Bonus Account be carried forward and distributed with Merit Bonuses for 1984/85. (c) The balance of \$1,107,082 in the Industrial and Mining Distribution Account be carried forward and distributed in 1985/86. (d) An amount of \$4m appropriated from previous year's surplus to the General Reserve be reappropriated to Bonus Distribution to 30 June 1985. This adjustment will leave the General Reserve at \$18m. The matter has been discussed with officers of the Treasury Department who concur with these proposals. IT IS THEREFORE RECOMMENDED that in pursuance of the provisions 8. of the Workers' Compensation Act 1916-1983, the approval of the Governor in Council be sought for the appropriation of funds as detailed in paragraph 6 above.
