- 2 -Reports by the local Shire drought Committee indicate that rainfall registrations recorded for the centres of Cloncurry, Dajarra, Duchess and Granada are indicative of conditions being experienced throughout the Shire as a whole. The rainfall registrations for these centres clearly indicate that the Shire falls within the rainfall guidelines for declaration in relation to the departure from the 1985/86 summer's average rainfalls. The Department of Primary Industries reports conditions in the Shire to be as follows -With below average summer rainfall in 1985/86, available pasture has been limited and surface water supplies have not been replenished. Large numbers of stock have already been sold or moved to agistment. However, even with these mitigation measures, available feed is very limited and further destocking will be necessary. A significant amount of drought feeding has also commenced. Due to the drought mitigation measures undertaken to date, stock is still in fair to good condition. However, further destocking and drought feeding will be required to reduce losses in condition to acceptable levels. Currently, 36% of the properties in the Shire have been granted IDP status, with new applications for drought declaration being received each week. Under the arrangements for financial assistance in drought stricken areas, the date appropriate for the declaration to take effect is the date on which the field officer's recommendation for the declaration is filed. The relevant date for the present recommendation is 1st April, 1986. IT IS THEREFORE RECOMMENDED that the Shire of Cloncurry be declared drought stricken as from 1st April, 1986. W.A.M.
