WHEREAS Our Trusty and Well-beloved CHARLES JAMESON, Esquire, a Judge of District Courts of Our State of Queensland, in consequence of his having to perform judicial duties as an Acting Judge of the Supreme Court at Townsville, is unable to attend and preside at the Sittings of the District Courts, appointed to be holden at Townsville, Winton, Hughenden, Charters Towers, Cloncurry, Cairns, Herberton, and Cooktown, in Our said State, on the Fifth, Fourteenth, Nineteenth, Twenty-second, Twenty-eighth days of February, and the Fourth, Ninth, and Twentieth days of March, in the year of Our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twelve, respectively: AND WHEREAS it is provided by "*The District Courts Act, 1891*," that in case of the illness or absence of a Judge of District Courts, the Governor in Council may appoint another Judge or a Barrister or Solicitor of at least five years' standing, to act as the Deputy of such Judge during such absence or illness: NOW KNOW YE, that We, reposing especial trust and confidence in your loyalty, learning, integrity, and ability, have thought fit, with the advice of Our Executive Council of Our said State, to constitute and appoint you, and do hereby constitute and appoint you, the said Honourable JAMES GEORGE DRAKE, being a Barrister of five years' standing and upwards, to be and to act as the Deputy of the said Judge of District Courts, at the Sittings of the District Courts appointed to be held as aforesaid at Townsville, Winton, Hughenden, Charters Towers, Cloncurry, Cairns, Herberton, and Cooktown, to have, hold, exercise, and enjoy the said office during good behaviour, together with all the rights, powers, privileges, and advantages thereunto belonging or appertaining.


